Standard 9: Superintendent's Objective Performance Standards

- During the 2023-2024 school year, the District Superintendent will continue to meet with multiple stakeholder groups, including members of the School Board, staff at each District building, student leaders, members of local Emergency Services, and the Council Rock community to identify strengths and areas for growth in the Council Rock School District.
- 2. During the 2023-2024 school year, the District Superintendent will use data analysis of student performance to guide strategizing with building administrators and teachers to expand homework clubs, clinics, differentiated teaching, and remediation to continue to address interrupted learning.
- 3. During the 2023-2024 school year, the District Superintendent will facilitate the implementation of the Safety and Security grant as awarded by the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency, pursuant to the conditions and requirements of the grant approval, including managing the submission of timely and detailed information aligned with PCCD's reporting requirements. The Superintendent will submit a report on the first phase of implementation of the 2023-2025 PCCD Safety Security Grant to the Board no later than June 30, 2024.
