Occupational Information

Elementary School

All students take a personality quiz to better understand their innate strengths and weaknesses. The students also take an interest inventory to explicitly show them the global fields in which their interests lie. Follow-up classroom-wide discussions with the counselor center around how to mesh the findings from these measures to determine a broad sense of a career path. Students also learn valuable employment-related skills of growth mindset and conflict resolution to help them be as successful as possible in the job place.

Middle School

All students participate in the Guided Exploration class, which helps them understand career paths and options and also provides direct guidance on how to attain such goals, including resume writing, the application process, and interviewing.

High School

All ninth graders are introduced to Naviance, an electronic system in which they can explore the 16 National Career Clusters. By selecting one cluster, they are taken to a lengthy list of options of employment areas within each cluster. All ninth graders also participate in an assembly regarding the technical institute and its offerings. High school students also have access to the Cooperative Education Program in the event that they are interested in a vocation that is not available to them at the technical school. Finally, high school students are afforded the opportunity to participate in the College Accelerated Program (CAP), which allows them to take courses at an accredited college institution that simultaneously earn college credits and satisfy high school graduation requirements.

Cooperative Education Program

Type of Program: Diversified Occupations

Diversified Occupations is a planned vocational program which may be offered at either the area vocational-technical school or **comprehensive high school**. The program prepares a heterogeneous group of students for **more than one vocational education area** of instruction for gainful employment. The diversified occupations program shall be available as a **one-year or two-year program**. This program is for **11th and 12th grade students** who are unable to gain admission to a vocational program due to excessive numbers of applicants, inability to meet entrance requirements for other existing vocational programs, or **lack of specific vocational areas offered at the comprehensive high school** or participating area vocational technical school. ¹

Classroom Instruction Requirement: Daily class (current schedule)

For school district-operated diversified occupation program, students shall meet with their teachercoordinator for at least **one 40 to 45-minute period per day** or a minimum of three hours per week.²

Worksite Visitation Requirement: Once a month for general oversight

For school district-operated diversified occupation program, worksite observation by the teachercoordinator **should occur twice a month but must occur once a month during regular school hours**. If a worksite issue arises, visits should occur once a week for a month or until the issue is resolved whichever is later.³

Student Work Requirement: 15 hours a week for at least 150 school days

Students shall be legally employed a minimum of 15 hours a week during the school year. Students shall be legally employed a minimum of 150 school days to be eligible for PDE reimbursement.⁴
