





Hillcrest Elementary School Additions and Renovations:

Construction Update

- ✓ The interior and exterior demolition is complete.
- ✓ The underground stormwater management system is complete
- ✓ Roof replacement has commenced and will be performed in small areas to ensure the building interior remains weather tight
- ✓ Waiting for PECO to relocate the gas line impacting footing installation
- ✓ Interior renovations in progress including concrete floor infill and cold form metal framing
- ✓ Follow-up on quarry tile floor sounding, adhesion and durability testing



















Sol Feinstone Elementary School Additions and Renovations:

Construction Update

- ✓ Phase I building demolition complete
- ✓ Temporary classroom construction is complete and occupied
- ✓ Unsuitable Soils were replaced with natural stone
- ✓ Foundations at the new CR wing are in progress
- ✓ The structural steel delivery for the classroom wing has been delivered.
- ✓ The interior renovations are in progress
- ✓ Storm piping and structured expected to commence by end of September
- ✓ Installing temporary generator to expedite construction of new electrical room


CRHS South Synthetic Turf Project – Construction Update

CRHS South Synthetic Turf Project:

Construction Update

- ✓ Site excavations generally complete
- ✓ Underground stormwater management system complete.
- ✓ Electrical service extended from electrical room to new service at site
- ✓ Water service extended from the existing building to site.
- ✓ Synthetic turf has been delivered to the site
- ✓ The stone base for the field has been installed infiltration testing
- ✓ Infiltration testing to confirm a minimum of 20" of rain per hour
- ✓ After multiple infiltration tests, the turf installation commenced
- ✓ Project remains on schedule for a late October 2021 completion

The delivery of construction materials and equipment continues to challenge the construction industry. Delivery dates are often missed with no confirmation of actual planned delivery dates.

The CRSD/D'Huy continue to 'bird-dog' the delivery of materials for all projects.



2021-2022 CIP Preparation – Version v.10 for Presentation and Distribution October 2021

Preparing 2021-2022 CIP Version v.10

- Present and Distribute at the October FACCOM Meeting
- Identifying high need, deferred, preventative maintenance and non-renewal projects
- Update 5-year Capital Improvement Plan, Costs and Prioritization
- Borrowing for CIP needs
- Current 2021-2022 CIP Budget: \$2M (Reduced from \$3M) 2022 CIP Budget: \$7.4M

CRHS North Cast-in-Place Concrete Canopy Construction

- The existing East and West canopies were unprotected up to ~10 years ago
- CIP project ~2013 to repair the canopies, add a roof system and protect the concrete structure with an elastomeric coating system
- The existing concrete canopy columns are beginning to fail resulting from the corrosion of the reinforcing bars and electrical conduit and boxes embedded within the column construction. Approximately 13 of the 42 columns are exhibiting damage
- Initial observation were performed on 07SEP21. A second visit is planned for 16SEP21 to perform physical investigations.
- Final report forthcoming: Perform Life Cycle Cost analysis to determine complete canopy replacement versus concrete repairs and coating project. Budgeted for complete canopy replacement in CIP Version v.10.



2021-2022 CIP Preparation – Version v.10 for Presentation and Distribution October 2021

CRHS North Cast-in-Place Concrete Canopy Construction

- D'Huy Engineering, Inc. general scope of work includes:
 - ✓ Perform field survey to identify and document the cracks at each column, establish locations of deterioration and repairs, and assess any possible patterns to the deterioration
 - ✓ Perform selective probe openings (demo) at several column locations to determine column construction, locations of embedded items and extent of corrosion.
 (D'Huy and restoration contractor were on site 16SEP21 to perform investigations)
 - ✓ Preparation of findings and recommendations
 - ✓ Determine most feasible option (LCC) column repair vs. total canopy replacement
 - ✓ Update CIP accordingly



Environmental – Due Diligence Investigations



PA Act 39 of 2018 Lead in Drinking Water:

- To prevent exposure to lead contamination in the drinking water of Pennsylvania's schools, the Public School Code was amended in June 2018 by Act 39.
 - ✓ Encourage schools to test for lead in their drinking water;
 - ✓ Require schools that do not test to discuss lead issues at a public meeting; and
 - ✓ Implement a plan if results exceed the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) national primary drinking water standard of 15 parts per billion (ppb).
- Under Act 39 of 2018, schools may, but are not required to, test for lead levels annually in the drinking water of any facility where children attend school.









PA Act 39 of 2018 Lead in Drinking Water:

- If a school chooses not to test for lead levels, then the school must discuss lead issues in school facilities at a public meeting once a year. This meeting may be a stand-alone meeting or part of an existing public meeting (such as a school board meeting).
- CRSD's environmental consultant Element Environmental Solutions
 performed the districts annual lead in drinking water testing the week of
 09AUG21 (Excluding drinking fountains to be tested after the fountains
 are back in operation).
- A report on findings and remediation will be formally prepared, the preliminary findings are as follows:
 - ✓ 129 samples collected 1 was above the EPA action level of 15ppb
 - ✓ Location: CR STAR Center sink faucet 53ppb
 - ✓ Sample retaken and confirmed 29ppb
 - ✓ Action Plan: Contractor ordered new faucet for replacement

Wrightstown Elementary School – Waivers for SOC's and PCB's

Triennial DEP Waiver Renewal Process

- WES has carried waivers for the following:
 - ✓ Synthetic Organic Compounds (SOC's) Includes herbicides, pesticides, and other chemicals that come from agriculture, urban stormwater runoff or industrial activities.
 - ✓ Dioxin Includes byproduct in herbicide production
 - ✓ Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCB's) Industrial products or chemicals
 - ✓ Note: CRSD quarterly well testing did not reveal any contaminants
- Typically 'check a box' DEP has now requested that CRSD reach out to all neighbors within a half-mile of WES drinking water well to assess if they use chemicals that could potentially contaminate WES drinking water well:
 - ✓ Approximately 170 homeowners
 - ✓ Attempted to canvas individually, ceased after 40 visits without response
 - ✓ Sent letter with list of SOC, Pesticide and Herbicide trade names to each homeowner for completion and resubmission by 15SEP21
 - ✓ Only 5 responses received which will be sent to DEP (1 email & 4 calls)
 - ✓ If the Waiver Request is denied we will have to continue with quarterly testing estimated at \$2,650 per quarter (\$10,600 annually)

Workplace Safety Committee

Monthly Workplace Safety Committee Meetings:

- ✓ Annual Certification Training for Committee Members
- ✓ Monthly meetings with representatives from each school
- ✓ Meeting Minutes including attendees, tracking of workplace related injuries by category, tracking safety related concerns, custodial issues, etc.
- ✓ Benefits include, but are not limited to helping to minimize workplace injuries, addressing issues that could lead to injury and to periodically train select staff to avoid bodily injury
- ✓ Topics include, but are not limited to building and site related issues, cleaning, IAQ, snow/ice concerns, etc.

CRHS North Walt Snyder Stadium – Sound System Replacement

Proposed Sound System

Existing system is beyond its useful life:

- ✓ Repaired numerous times
- ✓ System failed at recent sporting event
- ✓ Only one speaker is functioning
- ✓ New system is needed, discussed replacement several years ago

Proposed new system:

- ✓ Proposals received from two vendors (The Zeo Group and Philadelphia Sound Productions)
- ✓ Schedule to be determined
- ✓ Includes lockable rack, digital processor, power amplifier, 4 JBL outdoor speakers, CD player, wireless microphones, labor and commissioning

Low Proposal:

✓ The Zeo Group - \$12,252.98 (From Maintenance Budget)
